Dear Members and Friends of Trinity,

A happy Easter to you all. I hope your celebrations of our Risen and Reigning Lord were joyous!

I wanted to let you all know that our Saturday bible and service times are changing beginning the first weekend of April. They will now be at 4 and 5 pm. 4 o'clock for bible study and discussion, and 5 o'clock for service.

The Endowment Fund of Trinity Lutheran Church

Spring is here and the Endowment Fund Committee would like to remind everyone about the importance and the purpose of the Trinity Endowment Fund here at Trinity. The Fund was established by those who were dedicated to the mission that

there should be a way to help Trinity Lutheran Church continue to be an important Christian voice in the Wyandotte area for many years into the future. Trinity is one of the oldest continuing congregations serving this downriver area.

In order to continue our success, we must ensure that financial resources to accomplish that mission be there when needed. The best way to accomplish this is to build up the Endowment Fund to carry the congregation along when normal funding cannot fulfill our obligations.

That does not mean the Fund will take care of the day-to-day operations of the congregation. The resources to cover the normal expenses of a working congregation must be supplied by the membership. Without the support of our members the church will fail in our mission.

The Endowment Fund is to provide for items that the congregation needs that fall outside the regular budgeted items.

The funds to help in this area can only come from the earned income and revenue generated by the Endowment Fund's principle. The higher the amount of principle, the higher the income, the more we can provide for these unbudgeted needs.

So, with that, the Endowment Fund Committee would like to encourage everyone to support the Fund and set aside some gifts over and above your normal giving. You could also provide for a gift to Trinity in your will. This will help the Fund grow so we can provide for those very important items that help Trinity be all that it can be for now and well into the future.
